Plans are being finalized for our 21st association reunion in Tampa, Florida. Complete reunion itinerary and registration form will be mailed early next year. (note-there is more than one Doubletree Hotel in the Tampa area.) The special rate for our group is \$88 + tax. This rate is available three days before the reunion and for three days following the reunion based on room availability. The \$88 rate is for either a room with a King bed or a room with two Queen beds, single or double occupancy. This special rate will be available until May 26, 2011 or until the block of rooms reserved for our group is sold out. THE REGISTRY OF THE AMERICAN SOLDIER

The Army Historical Foundation seeks to educate future Americans to fully appreciate the sacrifices that generations of American soldiers have made to safeguard the freedoms of this nation. It's motto of the Foundation--Preserve the Heritage...Educate the Future-summarizes its mission.

In 2000 the Secretary of the Army designated the foundation as its primary partner in the building of the National Museum of the United States Army. The National Army Museum will be located at Fort Belvoir, Virginia and will preserve, study, and interpret more that 750,000 Army artifacts and works of art dating back to the days of the Continental Army to present day. The Museum also will be the nation's preeminent facility honoring 30 million men and women who have worn the Army's uniform.

Presently, the Museum is building *The Registry of the American Soldier*. This Registry provides a unique opportunity to recognize and honor Soldiers who are currently serving, and those who have served in the U.S. Army, Army Reserve, or the Army National Guard.

If you have not noticed lately, several major improvements have been made to the hill4-11.org web site. I hope they will make your user experience with the hill4-11.org Web site a more rewarding and enjoyable one.

Here is a list of the new features or additions that have been made recently:

- A new blog site called Hill 4-11 News has been setup at http://hill4-11.blogspot.com. There is also a link to it on the hill4-11 org Web site. The intent of this blog site is to provide members with more timely news about the Hill 4-11 Association and its members or other events of importance. If you want to post an article on the site, just send me an email containing your article, with wording exactly as it should appear on the blog. You can also subscribe to an Atom feed for this blog and you can also choose to be a follower.
 - only want to view the data, use the following User ID/password combination to log into the databases: guest/guest. If you want to enter new records in the databases you will need to create your own User ID/password. Just follow the instructions on the screens. Your User ID/password works for all three databases. You will only be able to update or change the records you enter or own. You can't change records created by someone else. Also, if your roster or Purple Heart record is already in the database and you want to change or control your personal records, send me an email so I can assign ownership to you. For updates and changes to records you do not own, you can use the on-line update forms and they will be emailed to me automatically. For the Roster database, please note that if your address and phone number is entered it will not be viewable by the general public. However, your email address will be visible, if available.

The Memorial, Purple Hearts, and Roster pages have all been replaced with databases. If you

- The Guestbook has been replaced with one that is more secure. This should just about eliminate most of the spam messages. Your email address will also not be shown or linked to your name. Therefore, when you leave an entry in the Guestbook you will need to put your email address in the message area if you want others to be able to email you directly. There is a new button for the Guestbook in the menu list. Be sure to check with the Discussion Board described below. There may be a forum there that may be more appopriate than using the Guestbook for your entry.
- A Feedback Form button has also been added to the menu list. Use this form to provide me with your suggestions for improving the hill4-11.org Web site.
- A new Discussion Board has been installed. This Discussion Board has built-in security measures to prevent spamming and "bots." There is also a new menu button for the Discussion Board on the hill4-11.org Web site. When you click the menu button you will be directed to a new page that displays the Discussion Board. You can also go directly to the Discussion Board by using this link http://hill4-11.org/phpBB3 in your Web browser. You can view or browse through the Discussion Board without having to log on. However, if you want to make a post

or reply to any of the forum categories or topics, you will need to register for a Username and password. This is very easy to do. When you register for a Username and password, you can type in just about anything to create your Username, including spaces. However, if you want others on this Discussion Board to be able to recognize who you are, you may want use your real name or some form of it. You can be as anonymous as you want to be. The choice is yours. There is also a FAQ section on the Discussion Board that should just about answer all of your questions. Please use this Discussion Board to post news worthy information in the appropriate forums. The list of forums/subforms is by no means complete. If you have a recommendation for a new forum category or subforum, please send me an email message. Please use this community based Discussion Board. It is a great way to communicate and stay in touch with each other. I have also posted the Daily Staff Journals for July and August 1969, several copies of the Trident Newsletter, some past copies of the Hill 4-11 Association Newsletter, some new pictures, new stories, awards, remembrances, etc., on the hill4-11.org Web site. Just go to the What's New? page to find the latest additions to the content. The scholarship forms have been updated on the hill4-11.org Web site with the appropriate contact information. I have also added new buttons, new background (green rice plants), and a new logo on the hill4-11.org Web site. What's missing? Your content or contributions to hill4-11.org Web site. A funeral mass was held at St. Phillip of Jesus Catholic Church with internment at Fort Sam Houston National Cemetery with military honors.



The youngest KIA is believed to be Dan Bullock at 15 years old.

The oldest person on the Wall is believed to be Dwaine McGriff at 63 years old.

There are 16 Chapteins on the Wall (2 Medal of Honor)

There are 16 Chaplains on the Wall (2 Medal of Honor).

There are eight women on the wall (7 Army 1 USAF) Of these 8 women, Army Nurse Lt. Sharon Lane was KIA in a rocket attack on Chu Lai in June 1969. The most casualties for a single day was January 31, 1968-245 casualties.

Highest state casualties - West Virginia, 711 casualties, 39.9 per 100,000 people.

Oklahoma had the second highest casualties.

Highest high school casualties-Thomas Edison H.S., Philadelphia, PA.-54 casualties.

Largest per capita loss-Beallsville, OH. (pop. 475) -6 casualties between 1966 and 1971.

Cpl. Thomas W. Bennett of Morgantown, WV was a US Army medic KIA on February 11, 1969. He was the only conscientious objector to be awarded the Medal of Honor during the Vietnam War.
